About Long Hunter State Park

It's becoming apparent that our parks are slowly losing the ability to cope with the constant increase of visitors and their needs. In order to meet these needs, our parks require a proportionate growth of funds for more facilities, equipment, materials, educational programs, expansions, and personnel. Long Hunter State Park is no exception. It is located within a one hour drive of more than 770,000 people. From July of 2012 to June of 2013, it was used by over 800,000 visitors. Without outside help, Long Hunter State Park cannot hope to keep pace with the needs of the ever growing population surrounding it. The park's use and enjoyment could be lost forever to present and future generations.

Area - 2,456 acres of diversified wildlife habitat, including 110 acre Couchville Lake and more than 20 miles of shoreline within the park's boundaries.

Trees - Over 25 species such as bald cypress, black willow, hickories and maples.

Wildflowers - Over 120 species, 14 of which are rare or endangered, such as the Missouri primrose, limestone fameflower and Nashville breadroot.

Animals - Whitetail deer, cottontail rabbit, eastern woodchuck, squirrel (some white), opossum, fox, raccoon (one white), mink, muskrat, weasel and skunk.

Birds - More than 60 species, a few of which are Canadian goose, woodduck, great blue heron, green heron, osprey, barred owl, pileated woodpecker, ruby-throated hummingbird, Eastern bluebird, American goldfinch and Cooper's hawk (rare).

Recreation - Hiking, fishing, boating, canoeing, primitive camping, picnicking, swimming, nature study and photography.

Education - Programs are carried out both on and off site. They are geared mainly toward schools, churches and scout groups, as well as the general public. Topics such as geology, history, aquatic biology, earth science, environmental issues and nature are covered.
